

ValueOptions® New Mexico created the new Community-Based Services Expansion Program this year to provide an additional \$7.9 million to develop community-based behavioral health care services statewide. Coupled with the \$3.1 million being disbursed through the 2008 Community Reinvestment Program, a total of more than \$11 million is being invested in New Mexico communities to provide local care across the state. These funds became available as a result of effective management of public health care dollars ValueOptions® New Mexico receives along with an overall effort by the state to increase enrollment. Every dollar saved is being returned to the community to support behavioral health care services.

This funding ensures that more and better services than ever before will be available to behavioral health care consumers in the communities where they and their loved ones live.
